eBooks by the Byte

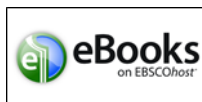
The Library offers thousands of ebook titles through its various databases. [EBSCO eBook Academic Collection](#) has more than 100,000 titles from academic publishers worldwide. Books may be read online, or downloaded to smart devices. We're in the process of adding these records to our catalog (HALCat), but in the meantime, they can be found directly through EBSCO.

Other ebooks may be found by searching in [HALCat](#) or [Research@UWW](#).

After doing a search in [Research@UWW](#), use the facets on the left sidebar to limit to *Electronic Books* (under *Genre*).

In [HALCat](#), use the phrase "electronic resource" in your search to limit to ebooks. Here's an example: "Crimean war" and "electronic resource." Depending on the search terms, a few media items may also appear in the search results along with the ebooks.

We received quite a bit of feedback from faculty. Most of it was lukewarm toward the new product and more favorable toward *Films on Demand*.

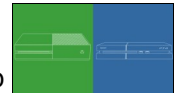
For now, we plan to renew *Films on Demand* for 2015 and will revisit the funding situation again next year.
