Research As Inquiry

This is our fourth in the series on the [Information Literacy Framework for Higher Education](#). This month we focus on *Research as Inquiry*. In this frame, we encourage students to think of research as an open-ended discussion: they engage with information by tapping into their intellectual curiosity, asking questions, and being flexible. Ambiguity can help them with the research process.

The questions librarians have posed to help students understand this frame are:

- ◆ What do you already know about the topic, and what do you need to explore further?
- ◆ What is the dialogue or debate surrounding your topic?
- ◆ Think about likely reliable sources. Who might produce this information?
- ◆ Has your research taken you down an unexpected path? Should you modify your focus?

As a recap from previous newsletters, the six information literacy “frames” from the Association of College & Research Libraries guide us in developing a deep understanding of how information is created, shared, and valued within specific contexts:

- Authority Is Constructed and Contextual
- Information Creation as a Process
- Information Has Value
- Research as Inquiry
- Scholarship as Conversation
- Searching as Strategic Exploration
