The *New York Times* may claim to have all the news that's fit to print, but the Library's news coverage doesn't stop there. We offer worldwide perspective on the news that's current as of today. [ProQuest Newspapers](#) offers more than 700 U.S. and international newspapers with coverage starting in 1980.

You may search all papers or limit a search to a specific paper. Papers include *Wall Street Journal* (1984-present), *New York Times* (1980-present), *Chicago Tribune* (1985-today), *Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel* (1995-present), *Times* (London, 1992-present), *Wisconsin State Journal* (1991-present). And for historical research, we offer [ProQuest Historical Newspaper: New York Times](#) (1851-2005) — the PDF files are complete with advertising and photographs.

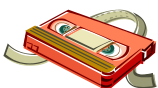
