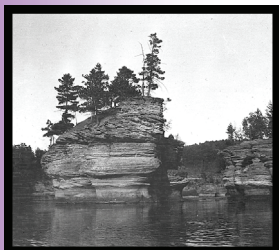

The University of Wisconsin Digital Collections Center creates and provides access to digital resources to support the teaching and research needs of the UW community. These collections are the result of collaborative effort between UW System faculty, staff, and librarians and public libraries throughout the state. The digital resources document the university and the State of Wisconsin, and provide access to rare or fragile items that have intrinsic research value.

The digital collections include books, journals, manuscript collections, photographs, slides, maps, prints and posters as well as audio and video files.

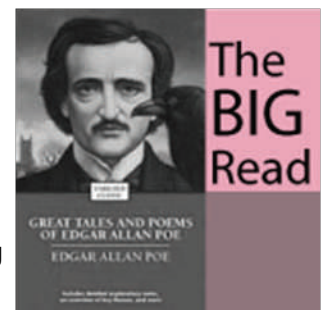
