Information Creation As a Process

In the December newsletter we presented the first in a series of articles on the Library's adoption of the Assn. of College & Research Libraries' Information Literacy Framework. This month we'll examine frame two, **Information Creation as a Process**: *When information is created to communicate a message, the format and means of delivering the message are deliberate choices, and they reflect the research process.*

The questions librarians have crafted to help students understand this frame are:

- ◆ How do the authors' choices of format and delivery of their information affect how that information might be used and perceived?
- ◆ Which elements of the creation process (such as research methods, review processes, or time constraints) may be indicators of quality or accuracy?
- ◆ How are the various types of information products valued in different settings, such as academia or a workplace?

As a recap from the last newsletter, these six information literacy "frames" guide us in developing a deep understanding of how information is created, shared, and valued within specific contexts:

- Authority Is Constructed and Contextual
- Information Creation as a Process
- Information Has Value
- Research as Inquiry
- Scholarship as Conversation
- Searching as Strategic Exploration

Scholarly Open Access Journals

Many faculty have used Jeffrey Beall's [Scholarly Open Access](#) blog (link is from Wayback Machine) to help verify the credibility of scholarly open-access journals. Beall, a librarian from Univ. of Colorado Denver, kept a list of "predatory" open access publishers that scholars relied upon to assess open-access sources before submitting articles for publication. Beall's defines predatory publishers as those that charge authors to publish their works, have low acceptance standards and an inadequate peer-review process.

As you might imagine, targeted publishers took a dim view of the services provided by Beall's blog and some threatened legal action. Some librarians felt that his criticism of *potentially* predatory journals was unfair since their faults were only suspected (Davis, P.
