## Elsevier Journals Still Here 😊

You'll be pleased to know that [Elsevier ScienceDirect](#) journals are still available through Andersen Library. Some eleventh hour negotiating and a generous contribution from the UW System administration will help us continue our Elsevier journal subscriptions without interruption for at least the next five years.

Given the high usage (more than 41,000 articles downloaded at UWW last year), our campus and UW System administration felt strongly that we needed to continue this subscription to support the research and teaching of the University.

The five-year deal still extends our access back to 1995 and actually gives us ownership of 23 Elsevier titles, including *Body Image*, *Computers in Human Behavior* (our highest-use title), *Economics of Education Review*, *The Lancet*, *Public Relations Review* and *Safety Science*. Seven other UW campuses were also able to get in on this deal.

The [ScienceDirect](#) interface will remain the same and the suite of 2,000+ titles will be nearly identical.

## WorldCat Makeover

Whether you're new to [WorldCat](#) or already an aficionado, you'll want to take a look at the newly-released interface. It's a little hard to tell you're actually there (no heading). But once you've tried it for a while, we hope you'll like it.

WorldCat is a catalog of holdings for more than 10,000 libraries worldwide. While it doesn't include every library, it does cover most of the public Library systems in our state and just about all college and university libraries throughout the US and Canada, not to mention thousands of libraries across the globe.

How WorldCat can help you is that it's the quickest way to create an ILLiad interlibrary loan request for books or media that aren't available through UW System borrowing. Just select the title you want, click the Request Item link, login to ILLiad with your netID and submit your request. Easy, huh?
