

### Compact Shelving on the Move

During the summer, librarians will review the rest of the Remote Storage/Compact Shelving Collection. Items that have been used in the past 5 years will be retained and most of the remaining titles will be withdrawn. In the Fall, faculty will be given time to review the titles selected for withdrawal. These books will also be offered to other UW libraries before they are actually withdrawn.

The compact shelving itself will be used to expand the on-site storage capacity of Special Collections materials, since Special Collections/Area Research Center and Archives now occupies the former Media Center, where the shelving is located.

### First & Second Floor Enhancements

If you've been in the Library this spring, no doubt you have noticed some shifting of the collections. On the second floor, the Government Documents Collection has been

scaled back and compressed to make additional space for the preK-12 collections. Children's books are being moved to

lower shelving to make them easier to browse and to allow natural lighting into the Library from the sunny eastern exposure that had been hidden behind tall shelving.



In the Periodicals area on the first floor, light-



colored wooden shelving has replaced some of the blue and orange metal shelving. The new look is brighter and makes the first floor a more attractive study space.
