With thousands of books and media to choose from on Library shelves, inquiring minds have asked which subject areas are most popular with our users.

Here's a snapshot of the subject areas with the most check-outs this academic year. This reflects collections that use Library of Congress classification so most children's books and media collections are not included. Checkouts of these collections totaled 18,358. As you might imagine, humanities and social sciences top the list.

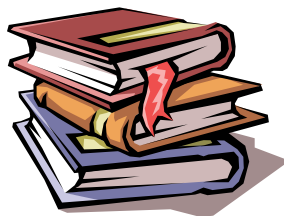
Summer Reading

BookScan Station

Libraries everywhere are offering new technology to make scanning simpler and to transition from costly photocopiers.

The Library has 10 scanner workstations distributed throughout its three floors. But it's often hard to find one that's not in use. And since it takes a while to login to the scanner computers and navigate the scanning programs, this task can be a real time sink.

The BookScan Station is changing all that. Using the touch-screen monitor, it takes only seconds to copy pages from a book or feed loose sheets through the document feeder which copies up to 40 loose sheets at a time (single- or double-sided).



The scanner is located across from the Reference Desk, so stop by to try it out.
