## Ebrary Ebooks

[Ebrary Academic Complete](#) replaces our *EBSCO ebook Academic database*. Ebrary offers 120,000 titles with unlimited simultaneous users per title. Books can be read online or downloaded to devices. Books may be checked out for 14 days and can be renewed indefinitely.
